Welcome to the 31st Annual London Artists' Studio Tour!

Over our 31 years of opening London studios to the public, hundreds of local artists have presented a wide variety of work in all media. This year 31 artists will display drawing, graphic design, painting, sculpture, pottery, and textiles.

Approaches range from traditional to experimental. Media encompass oil, watercolour, acrylic, found object assemblage, metal, wood, wool, paper, clay, encaustic, silk and more. Some artists are veterans of the Tour. Some are new to the Tour and to London.

The London Artists' Studio Tour is a juried event. Participants are a mix of professional artists and non-professional artists who are living and working in the City of London.

The Tour is as much about the process of creating art as it is about the art works themselves. Browsers are welcome. Artists are present in their studios for the duration of the Tour and are happy to explain their creative approach and answer any questions.

We strive to keep it fresh and exciting. Eight of this year's artists are new to the Tour. We also embrace the element of surprise: watch for pop-up demonstrations and special guest artists.

This is a self-guided tour and is free of charge. Friday, April 19th is the opening night. Come early for refreshments and first choice of work. You will leave inspired and eager to explore other studios.

Chris enjoys spending time with nature, whether it's hiking in the Georgian Bay area in Banff and British Columbia, or just relaxing outdoors. Chris is a self-taught fabric/textile artist and has been working with fabric for approximately 10 years, gradually teaching herself how to create realistic landscape art. With over 150 bolts of fabric in her work storage area she can usually be found working on one or more pieces of art most days. Her work can be seen at various local galleries as well as Stratford's Art In The Park during the summer months.

When viewed from a distance Chris' art looks like a painting, people are amazed when they realize it is all done with small pieces of fabric that are carefully layered, stitched and stretched on canvas. While there are several textile artists in the area Chris' art is still considered unique in the way that it is done.

Having worked extensively in other media - including digital

prints — since graduating from Ontario's Bealart, Benz has also had a rich career as a DJ and producer of electronica. This creative journey through music and visual art has given him a broad palette from which to create his bold pieces.






